Please inform the Chief of Staff if the invitation is to be extended to the First Lady. Will the registration for the First Lady be covered by your group and what activities will she be asked to participate in during the visit?

The more information you are able to provide, the easier it will be to fit the visit into President Mike's travel schedule. If you have more than one event you would like to invite him to, please prioritize which event is your first choice.
